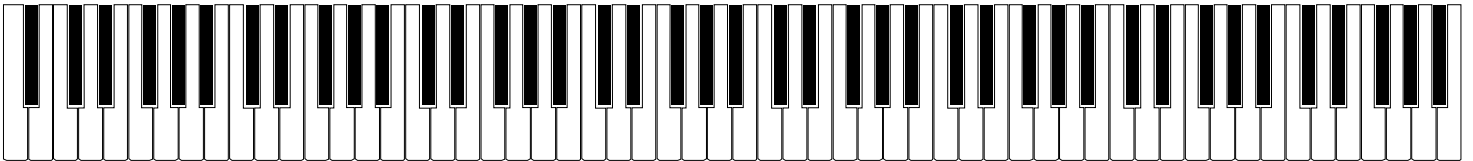
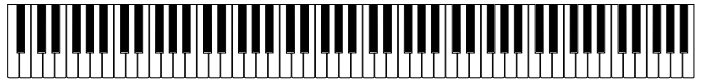


Chopsticks of Life
